NOMINEE BIOS (alpha-order)

David Bailey

David served in Company F, 422nd Infantry and the 106th Infantry Division. In the European theatre, he served in four campaigns: Northern France, the Ardennes, the Rhineland, and Central Europe. David is decorated with the Combat Infantry Badge, the Order of Saint Maurice, and two Bronze Stars - one for Valor, in addition to several other military citations. David is involved with various Veteran organizations; he was the national president of the Battle of the Bulge Association, Inc. from 2010-2012 and currently serves as a board member. Over the past few years, David has served on the President of the United States Commission overseeing Veterans Day events held at the White House and Arlington National Cemetery. At 98 years old, David rarely misses board teleconferences, and tirelessly advocates for all Veterans.

Madeleine (Kraemer) Bryant

Madeleine is the daughter of the late Lt. Col. Fritz G. A. Kraemer, a lifetime member of the VBOB organization, who served proudly in the 84 th Inf Division (Railsplitters) during the Battle of the Bulge. Madeleine, an associate BOBA member and member of the MD/DC chapter since 2004, has served on the national board for many years in various capacities, including currently as Chaplain.

Madeleine is honored to have made several trips to Belgium and Luxembourg with Battle of the Bulge veterans, most recently in December 2019. These trips, plus reunions and commemorations, have built friendships that will truly always be part of who she is. Madeleine, although born in Germany, grew up in Washington, DC. Upon graduation from George Washington University, she served as a Peace Corps teacher in Guyana. She retired from Baltimore County Department of Aging, but continues her life-long commitment to volunteer work in her church and community.

She lives in Asbury Methodist Village, Gaithersburg, Maryland, not far from her son and his family.

Allen Cleghorn

US Army Colonel retired with over 25 years of active duty service with positions of responsibility to include Battalion and Brigade level Commands. Other senior positions assigned were in the areas of director of logistics, logistics manager and two US Army Diplomat positions in Australia and the Philippines. All senior Army positions involved contingency planning, supply chain management, distribution management, inventory management, transportation business programs and business process re-engineering. Most notable professional experience after a long Army career was with DynCorp International. Served as Program Manager (PM) in Afghanistan and Iraq dealing with a 400 million dollar supply, maintenance and teaching program. Also served as a Program Manager (PM) in the United Arab Emirates on all matters related to the Nation's entire military ground vehicle maintenance and supply program. This 300 million dollar program employed over 500 employees from 17 countries. All private sector positions involved knowledge in process design, process improvement, metrics development, personal development and employee mentoring. Notable educational achievements include a BS and MPA from the University of South Alabama and MS in National Strategic Recourse Management from the Industrial College of the Armed Forces, Washington, DC.

Alan Cunningham

COL Cunningham graduated with a B.S. in Chemistry from Worcester Polytechnic Institute, Worcester, MA. As a Distinguished Military Graduate from the Reserve Officer Training Corps, he was commissioned as an Infantry Second Lieutenant in the Regular Army. COL Cunningham received Infantry Platoon Officer and Heavy Mortar Platoon Officer training at Fort Benning, GA and served as the Heavy Mortar Platoon Officer and Assistant Battalion Supply Officer with the 1st Battalion 18th Infantry Regiment, 1st Mechanized Infantry Division, Fort Riley, KS as well as the Battalion Supply Officer for the Supply and Transportation Battalion, 1st Infantry Division. He was transferred to the Quartermaster Corps receiving Supply Officer Training at Fort Lee, VA and serving one tour in Vietnam as a Logistics Assistance Officer to the Republic of Korea Tiger Division. After Vietnam, he was the Installation Food Advisor at Fort Campbell, Kentucky before resigning from the Regular Army in 1975 transferring to the Army Reserve. Since joining the Army Reserve, he held Research and Development Officer positions as an Individual Mobilization Augmentee (IMA) with the Communications and Electronics Command at Fort Monmouth, New Jersey and Drilling IMA with Headquarters, Department of

the Army, The Pentagon, Washington, DC before retiring as a Colonel with over 32-1/2 years of combined military service.

On the civilian side, after obtaining a Masters of Business Administration from Babson College, Wellesley, MA, COL Cunningham worked as a consultant doing research on the automobile industry for the U.S. Department of Transportation. In addition, he was a Plant Manager and a Manager of Corporate Planning before teaching computer programming and systems engineering at Temple University as an Adjunct Lecturer for the Business School. After ten years of work outside the Government, he accepted a position in 1985 as an Operations Research Analyst with the U.S. Army Logistics Center, Fort Lee, VA before a change in mission and functions transferred him to the U.S. Army Training and Doctrine Command Analysis Center at Fort Lee. In his 28 years at Fort Lee, he analyzed many types of systems with an eye for logistics impacts. From 2003 until his retirement from civilian service in 2013, he was involved in performing analyses for the Reserve Components related to their movement from a strategic Reserve to an operational Reserve as well as incorporating the Reserve Components into the Army Force Generation Process.

In the community, COL Cunningham has held the positions of President, Willingboro, NJ Lions Club, Treasurer, Vice President, and President of the Richmond Chapter, Military Officers Association of America, and Treasurer of his local homeowners association. He was also a member of the Veterans of the Battle of the Bulge (VBOB) serving in the positions of Trustee, Chairman of the Futures Committee, VP Military Affairs, Executive VP, and President. After converting the VBOB to the Battle of the Bulge Association (BOBA), Inc. with a change in the Bylaws to accommodate more second and third generation participation, he became the Chairman of the Board in January 2017, a position he holds today. He will give that position up when a new President is named.

COL Cunningham's education also includes a Masters in Strategic Studies from the Army War College, Carlisle, Pennsylvania. He is a graduate of the Defense Leadership & Management Program and the Office of Personnel Management Executive Potential Program. Major awards include: Legion of Merit, Bronze Star Medal, Meritorious Service Medal, Army Commendation Medal with three Oak Leaf Clusters, Army Achievement Medal, Expert Infantryman Badge, Army Staff Identification Badge, and Commander's Award for Civilian Service with three Laurel Leaf Clusters.

Kristen Faller

I joined BOBA to honor my father, PFC Raymond Martens, 90th Division, 359, Co. L. He entered France on D Day +3, and fought in the Battle of the Bulge, being wounded January 9, 1945 in Luxembourg.
